ALLEANZA LIBERALI'S MANIFESTO FOR THE MALTA GENERAL ELECTIONS OF 2013

1 Tolerance. People who are allowed to think freely and develop in different directions, enrich the society both economically and culturally . We aim at a society with tolerance for the deviations - variety in cultural background and sexual preferences makes us stronger. Free individuals are the building blocks for our common future.

2 Business. Our future comes from our history. The future must be made by agreeable conditions for entrepreneurs, businesses and ambitious people. The growth, that makes our childrens prosperity, is in individual ideas, innovations and hard-working people.

3 Simplified EU. A feudal EU is a way to strenghten

Europe and clarify EU's competance - more than today. We want to deepen and simplify the European decision-making process - e.g. environment, trade, crime-fighting, integration and safety-policy. At the same time we must clarify what is not to be dealt with on the EU-level.

4 EU elections. To increase the democratic belief in the EU, the connections between the common interests and the decision-makers have to be clarified. Political top-positions have to be filled by direct elections by EU-citizens. The money- wasting monthly Parliament travel to Strassbourg must be stopped.

5 Border obstructions. When obstacles are removed and walls are torn down, the individual is much more allowed to build his/her own life and form a society, that suits people - not states. In the daily life - in the future world, national states and borders are less important than mans free will. The Liberal task is to identify obstructions against human beings freedom - and remove them.

6 Parliamentary Privileges. AL will push for the removal of the Parliamentary Privilege - this is being abused by many Parliamentarians to attack citizens, who, in return, cannot defend themselves or file court-libels.

7 Referenda. AL will propose the introduction of frequent referenda in order to increase our national democracy and decrease the dictatorship of the few in office over our fellow citizens. These referenda will be held electronically, thus reducing costs by a "thousand" times.

8 Party representation. AL is also demanding that all

Maltese Political Parties be represented at the Malta Broadcasting Authority, the Malta Electoral Commission, the Malta Planning and Environment Authority (MEPA) and other important authorities irrespective to whether they hold a seat in Parliament or not.

9 Pension. AL is proposing that all persons should get the best health services, education and pensions. Mentioning pensions, Alleanza Liberali wants to bring down the retirement age back to 61. Alleanza Liberali favours the employment of young people over that of senior citizens, many of whom ought to call it a day with their career and enjoy their pension in peace.

10 State funding. AL stands against financial support by the State to political parties, as it believes that such support would be distributed to the main political parties exclusively following the unjust argument that small parties are not represented in Parliament or hold only a couple of seats.

11 Abortion. A Liberal member of the Maltese Parliament, will present a private members' bill to decriminalize abortion and offer psychological support to pregnant ladies who "opt" to abort, contrary to the current system that sends them to jail. Dr. John Zammit has attended European conferences of the Planned Parenthood Federation in Brussels, the Federation on Family Planning about the problems of abortion, family planning and related problems. Statistics have it, that the majority of students at the Malta University share John Zammit's opinion.

1 12 Censorship must be completely abolished. Like the

rest of Europe, there should be no legal sieve that stops magazines, books, DVDs, drama and cinema, (as long as these would not be connected to acts of terrorism). Brothels and adult venues will be legalized and regulated. This implies that such places will be monitored by the government, unlike what has been happening for these last fifty years, where everything runs underhand and uncontrolled.

13 Cannabis. AL will present a private members' bill to decriminalize Cannabis.

14 Nudism. As regards to Nudist (Naturist) Beaches, AL will propose the introduction of private beaches where tourists and Maltese people would be able to swim in the nude. AL projects that the tourist turnover will double, if not triple, since nudism in Northern European countries is far more popular than we tend to presume, yet their climate is unsuitable. It is therefore propitious for Malta's economy to capitalize on this matter since our climate is favourable for nudism. The amateurish (and unofficial) Ġnejna Bay area is nowhere near the mega-project we have in mind for the island of Comino.
